Purpose and Responsibilities

Under the direction of the Executive Director and the Development and Communications Director, the Prevention Coordinator is responsible for implementing the Athletes As Leaders program, a teen dating and intimate partner violence prevention program aimed at female high-school athletes. This employee will work collaboratively with the current prevention coordinator who is implementing a similar prevention program for male high-school athletes.

Job Duties include:

- Establishing and maintaining relationships with local schools and sports programs, nonprofit partners, and community supporters.
- Launching and implementing the Athletes as Leaders (AAL) teen dating violence prevention program.
- Monitoring the success of the AAL program and making adjustments as necessary.
- Working with the Development & Communications Department staff to contribute to a social marketing campaign that will complement the prevention work being done.
- Coordinating trainings for coaches and mentors.

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- Strictly adhering to Stand Strong's Confidentiality Policy. Being responsible for protecting the confidentiality of all clients, AAL program participants, materials, and information.
- Attending all required meetings, including but not limited to department meetings, supervision meetings, and all-staff meetings.
- Presenting/teaching program content in the absence of an available coach.
- Other duties as assigned.
